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Usually parents feel relieved when their children enter normal kindergartens with academic performance near to their chronological age. On the other hand, they feel stress when they receive as discharge notice from the early education and training center. They are afraid that they are still incapable of handling their children's problem in daily living and facilitating the child's learning in future. Therefore, pre-discharge group was organized to give parents more support and training and to equip the children with more skill to adapt to daily living outside the center. The group was an interactive one which focused on four areas: problem solving, description, social skills and role play. Three characteristics of the group were emphasized. The first, was to involve the children in a simulated daily situation under a themtic approach. It induced their natural behaviour for parents to observe. The second one was to help parents to observe their children systematically with the aid of an observation guide for identifying their strengths and weaknesses. The third was to facilitate parents' discussion on how to develop children's learning in daily life, and to make appropriate suggestions to professionals. After eight group sessions, it was found that parents were able to identifying their children's problems and to make use of daily learning opportunities.



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
